Summer Overload Policy:

Undergraduate students must be enrolled in two courses per session for a maximum of 8 credits concurrently in any session. A limit of 16 credits for the entire summer is the maximum permitted.

A petition to the Standing of Students Committee prior to the start of the term is required for any of the following scenarios:

- 3 or more concurrent courses
- A 5th summer session course
- More than 8 credits in any summer session
- More than 16 credits for the entire summer term

A linked lecture and lab course (e.g. PHY 011 and 012) is counted as one course.

Research courses for the entire summer term are counted as one course.

Online courses count as one course.

If a student rosters more than two concurrent courses they are alerted via email to the students Lehigh University email address and asked to drop a course. If the student takes no action the Registrar's Office drops the last rostered course before the session starts.

The maximum number of courses and credits for summer include courses taken at other colleges/universities.
